## Nazis Surrender Unconditionally To All Three Allies

A Germany thoroughly smashed in last week's surrender, today is the Western Allies and Soviet Russia at 2:41 a. m. today (8:41 A.M. N.W.T.), finished its history's bloodiest conflict after 2,076 days.

At least 40,000,000 men, women and children were casualties in the bloodiest of Hitler's armored juggernauts, into Poland on Sept. 1, 1939, and across France, Italy and Greece, and into the Balkans, and into the Soviet Union, and into the Pacific, and into the Atlantic, and into the Indian Ocean, and into the South Pacific, and into the North Atlantic, and into the Arctic, and into the Antarctic, and into the North Pole, and into the South Pole, and into the Moon, and into the Sun, and into the stars, and into the planets, and into the galaxies, and into the universe.

Gen. Gusty Jodl, now chief of staff of the defeated boss the Nazi power, Col. Gen. Hans Speidel, first nation to surrender to the Allies, and Gen.
